

March 11, 2019

Commissioner Mayo, Commissioner Thurlow, and Commissioner Carlson were present at a regular meeting beginning at 8:00 a.m. The minutes were approved as printed. Payroll in the amount of \$183,256.53 was reviewed and approved by the Board.

Glenn Nelson met with the Board to discuss the street to his residence in Industry. Mr. Nelson purchased the property in 2011 and has had two loads of rocks placed on the street since then. He was told by the Highway Department that they were not going to maintain the street for they felt it was a private drive. The Commissioners looked at a map that Mr. Nelson provided and feel that it is a street that should be maintained but will discuss it with Mr. Tremblay and will get back with Mr. Nelson.

Ronnie Tremblay, Highway Department, met with the Board to give the weekly report. Commissioner Mayo asked Mr. Tremblay about the street in Industry. Mr. Tremblay had a couple of maps to review and it was decided that 3rd St is a public street and the County will need to maintain this street for Mr. Nelson. Last week the Department did snow removal on Monday and Tuesday and did repairs to the equipment the rest of the week. Mr. Tremblay stated that all of the pot holes on the black top roads should be fixed as of last week. They replaced some signs and continue to burn on the log jam in Mulberry Township. The Oil Distributor has an error code on it and will need to be hauled to Salina. Permission was granted to hire Larry Lund to haul the Distributor to Salina for \$300 to be repaired.

Rocky Cramer, EMS Director, and Deidre Stout, Assistant Director, met with the Board to give the weekly report. Mr. Cramer reported that on Saturday Medic 3 was on a call driving by 7th & Crawford and an object was thrown at the ambulance. It damaged the paint and dented a small area. There was a Police report made for this incident. Mr. Cramer will get estimates for the repairs and report back to the Board on the damage.

Mike Carney, Clay County Park Manager, met with the Board to present the estimates on the projects for the park. The estimate on the electrical work came in from Border States in two quotes for a total amount of \$3,909. This is for all parts except the wiring and Mr. Carney stated that he will be re-measuring for a more accurate amount of wire to order. Commissioner Thurlow made the motion to accept the two quotes in the amount of \$3,909 from Border States for the electrical project at the park. Commissioner Carlson seconded and the motion passed unanimously. The camper dump station is in need of being replaced. Mr. Carney provided an estimate from Holcom Concrete in the amount of \$3,225 for the concrete work and from D & R Plumbing for the plumbing and drainage in the amount of \$1,885. Commissioner Carlson made the motion to accept the estimates for the concrete and the plumbing in a total amount of \$5,110 for the replacement dump station. Commissioner Thurlow seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Chuck Dunn, Sheriff, met with the Board to give the weekly report. The flooring in the records office is in need of being replaced. Maintenance will remove the old flooring and will hire the new floor to be laid. The new floor tiles and sub flooring is estimated to cost \$1,200. The Board granted permission for this project.

Rhonda Carroll, Landfill Director, met with the Board to give an update on the Department. The Board signed an Event Approval for an employee to attend training in Manhattan, Kansas. The Board instructed Ms. Carroll to do away with the \$5.00 charge to pull a vehicle out if they get stuck on the Landfill property but continue to have individuals sign the Liability form before pulling them out.

The Board adjourned at 12:20 p.m.
